WALKING FOOT QUILTING

Class deposit: \$10 (returned in class)

You will learn to use a Walking Foot to quilt a small project such as a placemat or a small lap quilt. We will teach you to “sandwich” your quilt and help you choose an appropriate quilting design for your project. Quilting options will include “stitch in the ditch”, geometric quilting patterns, and creating quilting designs using freezer paper.

- Book recommended: “Foolproof Machine Quilting” by Mary Mashuta (out of print, but used copies available online \$7-10);
- Bring pieced placemats or a small pieced lap quilt ready to quilt, preferably a kit from Community Service, which can be turned in on Community Service Day in February (see Lynn Zacharias at the January meeting to check out kits that include backing and batting and we’ll also have kits available in class);
- Backing fabric measuring 4” larger than your top, an extra 2” on all sides – this may need to be pieced to appropriate measurements (included in Community Service kits);
- Batting of your choice measuring 4” larger than your top (included in Community Service kits);
- Sewing machine in good working order and manual;
- Walking foot that fits your sewing machine (required for class) and seam guide extension bar that fits it;
- Sewing notions, such as scissors, pins, seam ripper, etc.;
- Extra sewing machine needles;
- Blue painter’s tape;
- Large quilting safety pins or 505 Basting Spray (spray must be used outdoors);
- Chalk marker or water-soluble blue marking pen, depending on what will best show on your fabric;
- Freezer paper will be provided in class.
